
#### SAIDReturns to the "City of Oaks" for 2014 Meeting

Last fall, the members of SAID returned to North Carolina's Capital City for their 49<sup>th</sup> annual session. President Bob Hollowell planned an outstanding scientific program as well as some wonderful social events. The 2014 SAID Meeting featured a change in format. For the first time the annual strategic planning session was held as a dinner meeting on Wednesday evening



followed by two full days of Continuing Education on Thursday and Friday. The strategic Planning session was well attended

Thursday morning began with Bob Hollowell extending a warm Raleigh welcome to all attendees. The scientific session began with Dr. Michael Brennan speaking about Osteonecrosis of the jaw. He presented the most up-to-date information regarding pre-op considerations, recognition and treatment of Medication-related Osteonecrosis of the Jaw (MRONJ). After the break, Dr. Brennan moved on to a discussion of Xerostomia in which he detailed causes as well as the most current therapies regarding dry-mouth.





After lunch, Thomas Spangler from the American Dental Association gave attendees a national perspective on the Affordable Care Act

(ACA; also known as Obamacare). He discussed how our nation's new approach to health insurance might affect care for vulnerable populations. His talk was followed by a panel



discussion centered on a more local perspective. This was a lively session that left attendees with more questions than answers, extremely thought-provoking questions that became the basis for discussion throughout the session.

The day concluded with a reception and dinner hosted by President Bob Hollowell. As always, the night provided an opportunity for camaraderie, fellowship and discussion.



Friday morning began with breakfast and a welcome by Dr. Hollowell. He then introduced Dr. Allan Samuelson who lectured on minimally invasive treatment for geriatric patients. He provided literally dozens of helpful techniques that attendees could bring home to their practices on Monday. Reviewer" and he was thanked for his efforts during the many years that he has served SAID in this capacity.


